At least 3 linguistic groups can be distinguished in the North of the M-T + Tiwi as a distinct group (with similarities to Algonquin & Eskimo & perhaps some Borneo & parts of N.A.)

More fine subdivision could be made, but some of the groups have almost disappeared

1. NE Group

Mithiginki

Yrkkala

(Not quite Eylandt)

This group has no prefix, suffix or noun classification. Has vocabulary similarities also with W desert groups (Pitjara, Warlu, Pintubi - Aranda's somewhat different)

2 Central Group

Oerpelli

Maningreda - (same tribe)

Bamydi (formerly Besdielc)

Banyidi would be suitable -

The Gumbalong language is the type here

The central group is prefixing, suffixing
Dreda classifying & is most
widespread in Arnhem Land

3 Western Group

Also suffixing & prefixing, but
has characteristics which distinguish
it sharply from the Central group
Port Keats & Daly River would
be good sites. The latter is
recommended by Trigon

The Western Group is said to be distinct
from the Kuikerley languages, with still another
group interposed between them and the Western Group.
